

SUBJECT: WELSH**BRIEF OUTLINE OF COURSE AND COURSEWORK DEADLINES**

In Year 11 pupils study the remaining units of the 6 main topics. There will be 3 coursework deadlines during the year – one in the Autumn term and two in the Spring term. Pupils will take a mock exam in the Autumn term and these results, together with continuous assessment will decide whether pupils are entered for the Higher Tier (A*-D) or the Basic Tier (C-G).

**EQUIPMENT:

Exercise books, text books, revision notes, grammar note book plus any other materials required.
Ring binders - essential for filing should be purchased by students.

PARENTS SHOULD PROVIDE

Pens, pencils, ruler, etc. Ring binders. Dictionaries can be purchased but are not essential. We will provide these for classroom based work. They can, if wished be bought through the department.

HOMEWORK

Pupils will normally be given homework every other lesson and this will vary in nature. Much of the homework in Year 11 will be preparing for oral discussion, and the importance of thorough preparation in this area cannot be over-emphasised. Regular tests will be given, particularly in the final term to ensure that all work has been learnt well.
