

Digital Media Competition - How to enter

1 photo + Up to 50 words That's it!

You need to take one digital photo of anything, which you feel, represents your view of what Whitchurch High School means to you. It's up for you to decide - use your imagination! **Your photo** could be parts of the school site, an event coming up before the end of term, the visit of Macassar High School, Super Learning week, a piece of your work, friends or whatever! Then all you have to do is **write** up to 50 words to go with your photograph. Then **simply email** your photo and description, along with **your name and year group** (staff do not need to put a year group!) to the competition email address **before the end of term**.

All we ask is that if you take a photo of people that they agree to it and it must not be rude along with your account. You can enter as many times as you like but each photograph must have a different account and you cannot just change a few words!

Your photograph may be a large file size in which case please send a condensed version but keep the original in case you are a winner. We will be judging the photographs over the summer holidays. There will be prizes for the winners.

The top 12 photos and descriptions will be made into a digital calendar and published on the school's website for next year. If there are sufficient numbers each winner will receive a hard copy of the calendar.

We are happy that both pupils and staff use digital camera phones to take their pictures but we operate on a basis of trust. We are relaxing our normal rule about using these to run the competition. We do not expect people to bring in expensive digital cameras nor can we be held responsible for those who do.

However did you know that you could use a disposable camera? The pictures could be printed but ask for the shots to be put on a CD, then you have a set of digital photos!
